12 CONVERSIONEROM ZIMBARWEAN DOLLAR TO ZIMBARWEGOLD

Following the Introduction of the Zimbabwean Gold Currency by the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe (RBZ) on 5 April 2024 and the Statutory Instrument (SI) 60 of 2024, all the previously existing Zimbabwean Dollar (ZWL) balances were converted into ZWG as at that date. The swap rate of ZWG 1: ZWW 2 498.724 was used as guided by the closing Interbank exchange rate and the price of gold as at that date. The previously reported balances for September (income statement) were Inflated to the 31st of March 2024. These amounts were converted using the same rate for adoption as the comparative balances and current results in the Abridged financial results for the period ended 30 September 2026.
